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### 1.1 AIIMS, Kalyani

All India Institute of Medical Sciences was established by an Act of Parliament as an autonomous institution of national importance Under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana [PMSSY] similar to AIIMS New Delhi and its objectives and functions were defined. By virtue of this Act, the Institute awards its own medical degrees, diplomas and other academic distinctions. The degrees awarded by the Institute under the All India Institute of Medical Sciences Act are recognized Nursing qualifications by the Indian Nursing Council are deemed to be included in the first schedule of that Act, entitling the holders to the same privileges as those attached to the equivalent awards from other universities of India. The nursing college started its first academic session on 1<sup>st</sup> March 2022 with its first batch of nursing students with an uptake of 60 students. The admission process is being conducted through the common National Eligibility cum Entrance Test (Undergraduate) For NURSING by the National Testing Agency (NTA).

The Institute (AIIMS, Kalyani) is a residential University in which the faculty members, staff and the students live on campus. There are hostels for undergraduate and nursing students inside the campus.

## AIMS & OBJECTIVES

### 2.1 Mission

Main mission is to establish a centre of excellence in nursing education, training, health care and research imbued with scientific culture, compassion for the sick and commitment to serve the underserved.

### 2.2 AIMS

Correcting regional imbalances in the availability of affordable and reliable tertiary healthcare services and also to augment facilities for quality nursing education creating a critical mass of nurses and conduct research in the country relevant to the area.

### 2.3 OBJECTIVES

- a. To develop a pattern of teaching in undergraduate and postgraduate nursing education in all its branches so as to demonstrate a high standard of nursing education to all nursing colleges and other allied institutions in India.
- b. To bring together in one place educational facilities of the highest order for the training of the personnel in all important branch of the health activity.
- c. To attain self – sufficiency in post graduate nursing education



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he Course of studies leading to the award of B.SC (Hons) Nursing at of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences shall last for a minimum of **four years including 6months integrated internship.**

## NUMBER OF SEATS & RESERVATIONS

The **60 ( Sixty )** seats for Indian nationals are available for admission to B.Sc. (Hons) Nursing Out of these, **8 (eight)** seats are reserved for the Scheduled Castes, **3 (three)** seats for the Scheduled Tribes, **16 ( sixteen)** seats are reserved for Other Backward Classes ( non-creamy layer), **05 (five)** seats are reserved for economically weaker section (EWS, (UR)) and **27(twenty seven)**seats for General Category for Indian Nationals. One seat for persons with Benchmark Disability (PWBD) (yr) as per provision of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 shall be provided on horizontal basis, amongst the seats available subject to evaluation by the Medical Board of the Institute.

# ANTIRAGGING MEASURES

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#### SUPREME COURT RULES REGARDING ANTI RAGGING

As per direction of the Hon'ble Supreme Court of India, the Government has banned ragging completely in any form inside and outside the campus and all the AIIMS authorities are determined not to allow any form of ragging. Whosoever directly or indirectly commits, participates in, abets or instigates ragging within or outside any of the AIIMS shall have an FIR lodged against him/her and he/she will be suspended or rusticated from the institution and shall also be liable to be fined which may extend to Rs. 10,000/-. In case the applicant for admission is found to have indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she has indulged in ragging, admission can be refused or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution. The punishment may also include, suspension from attending the classes, withholding/ withdrawing fellowship/ scholarship and other financial benefits or withholding the result.

#### 5.2 ANTI RAGGING REGISTRATION

Selected candidates shall register themselves in the website [www.antiragging.in](http://www.antiragging.in) / [www.amanmovement.org](http://www.amanmovement.org) and take a print out and submit the self-attested printout to Academic Section within 7 days.

## 6.1 GENERAL

AIIMS Kalyani has a B.Sc (Hons) Nursing course divided into 4 year with 6 months integrated internship. The overarching goal is to cover the basics of all aspects of internship Nursing. Admitted candidates must attend the Orientation Programme and join classes on the stipulated date. The admission of the candidates, who fail to join the Course by the date stipulated in the letter of intimation, shall automatically be cancelled and such seats shall then be offered to the candidates on the waiting list in order of merit in the same category.

Candidates selected for admission to the B.Sc (Hons) Nursing course at the AIIMS Kalyani after verification of their eligibility and offered admission should bring the following original certificates/ testimonials/documents at the time of admission:

- I. Certificate of having passed the 10+2 or equivalent Examinations, showing the subject offered by him/her in the Examination
- II. Certificate from the Board from which he/she passed the High School/Higher Secondary Examination, showing his/her date of birth.
- III. Certificate/Mark sheet from the Board from which he/she passed the 10+2 or equivalent Examination showing that he/she has secured 60% or more marks (50% in case of SC/ST/Persons with Benchmark Disability) in aggregate in English, Physics, Chemistry and Biology.
- IV. Migration Certificate from the University/Board last attended by him/her.
- V. *Applicable only to candidate belonging to Scheduled Caste/Tribe/OBC/OPH Category:*
  - a. SC/ST Certificate issued by the competent authority. Community should be clearly mentioned in the certificate.
  - b. OBC Certificate issued by the competent authority. The sub-caste should tally with the **central list** of OBC. OBC candidates should not belong to Creamy layer. OBC certificate must be in the prescribed format.
  - c. Certificate from prescribed authority showing that he/she belongs to Persons with Benchmark Disability Category.

## 6.2 FEES &amp; OTHER PAYMENTS

The dues are to be paid in cash immediately, after you have been declared medically fit in the Medical Board of the Institute as per details given below:

The details of mode of payment would be intimated to the selected candidates in due course.

### 6.3 ATTENDANCE

A minimum attendance for passing the **B.sc (Hons) Nursing** course is mandatory.

A candidate must have minimum 80% attendance in theory and 80% in practical (irrespective of the kind of absence) for appearing in examination. However, in extreme circumstances beyond the control of the candidate 5% waive off of attendance may be done by the Dean Academics. A candidate must have 100% attendance in each of the practical areas before award of Degree.

**Any student with attendance less than the above norms will NOT BE PERMITTED IN THE final Examination.**

### 6.4 ATTEMPTS

1. Students would only be permitted to take final examinations if they get at least 50% marks in each subject in internal announcement.
2. If a candidate fails in the subject (either theory or practical) has to appear in the examination for both theory and practical paper of that subject.
3. If a candidate fails in any subject, maximum three attempts (including first attempt) are permitted for each subject.
4. A candidate, who fails in up to two papers, shall be admitted provisionally in the next year, but she has to clear those papers in next two subsequent examinations. If the candidate taking supplementary examination along with next year examination her result of next class will be declared only if she passes previous examination. Incase if she fails to clear supplementary examination in two subsequent attempts she would deemed to have failed.
5. If any candidate who could not pass all the subjects in 3 chances, including the regular chance, their result shall be declared as failed and she has to appear in all the subjects of that year in the subsequent annul examination
6. A candidate failing in more than two subjects will not be promoted to the next year and she has to appear in all the subjects of that year in subsequent annul examination without attending the regular course of instruction. However, if candidate wish re-attend the course of instruction of that year; she may avail this opportunity by paying the prescribed fee of that year. Furthermore, candidate may have a provision to improve the internal assessment marks of that year.
7. The maximum period to complete the course successfully should not exceed eight years.



## 6.5 WEIGHTAGE FOR INTERNAL MARKS

Twenty five percent of marks in the summative examination would be calculated from the daily evaluation and end semester examination marks.

A Candidate has to pass in and practical exams separately in internal assessment.

## 6.6 COMPULSORY INTERNSHIP TRAINING

- i. Six months compulsory internship starts after theory and practical training in five subjects of the fourth year of the course.
- ii. During internships students will be posted in all three shift duties and assume all the responsibilities of patient care in assigned area under the supervision of teacher/ faculty of the Department of Nursing/ College of Nursing.
- iii. Internship / Integrated practice is 8 hours of clinical duties per day.
- iv. Calculation of hours during internship to be done as 8 hours per day @ 48 hours per week.
- v. **Fourth year final examination to be held only after completing internship.**
